For the Michigan Israel Business Accelerator (MIBA), 2020 was a year of innovation, opportunity, and advancement. Despite the economic uncertainty brought on by the global pandemic, we continued to advance Michigan's innovation ecosystem and build meaningful collaborations between Michigan and Israeli businesses. Where others saw setbacks, we saw opportunities!

Throughout the year, we reinforced the value of building global partnerships between Michigan and Israel. While 2020 was not without its setbacks, we are proud of the many accomplishments from the past year and the impact we drove in the innovation ecosystem. Like so many others, we relied on technology to drive our business development across the Mobility, Defense, Cybersecurity, Food/AgTech, and Health/Life Science industries. Prior to the travel restrictions imposed by COVID-19, we hosted 13 Michigan companies on two trade delegations to Israel, including both the CyberTech and Industry 4.0 Conferences. Over the course of the year, through collaborative efforts with our partners, the MIBA served over 400 companies, helped create jobs, and set the conditions for significant partnerships in 2021 and beyond!

We look forward to continuing our mission to advance Michigan's innovation ecosystem through Israeli connections as we strive to **position Michigan as the premier partner for Israeli innovation**.

The support from our funders, donors and members is instrumental in building bilateral economic partnerships and advancing innovation opportunities between Michigan and Israel.



Our Approach

The MIBA Business Development Pipeline

Continue to increase both the quantity and quality of our **connects** in Michigan and in Israel.

Create valuable connections through effective matchmaking based on a deep understanding of needs, preferences, and capabilities.

Facilitate opportunities for collaborations that will result in positive economic outcomes for Michigan.

A network of decision-makers at organizations in both Michigan and Israel that includes partner economic development organizations, companies, and investors. Our intake process helps us to better understand their capabilities, needs, and objectives.

Connections

Exploratory meetings between 2 or more of our connects to determine the feasibility of a collaboration opportunity.

Collaborations

An agreement to execute economic activity that directly or indirectly benefits the state of Michigan. Types of economic activity we support and encourage are expansions (opening or expanding physical presence in the state and/ or hiring employees), imports and exports of goods and services, corporate partnerships, investments, and participation in grant, pilot, or business accelerator programs.

This approach proved very effective in 2020:


Our **268 Connects** resulted in **54 Connections,** of which resulted in **7 successful Collaborations** by the end of the year.


These collaborations:

- Created 4 jobs
- Attracted **5** Israeli companies to the Michigan ecosystem
- Helped 2 Michigan companies gain exposure to a major player in their industry
- Over a 300% increase of Foreign Direct Investment into Michigan

Our Pipeline





Being named as MEDC's **lead** for export opportunities to **Israel** and as Michigan's representative at the International Defense Expo in Abu Dhabi in early 2021 helped identify multiple opportunities for **exports** in the **defense** sector.

In addition to export and import opportunities, 25% of our pipeline consisted of expansion opportunities where companies are looking to open offices or manufacturing facilities in Michigan and create jobs. Other outcome types that we support and track include Israeli companies applying for grants and pilot programs as well as participation in accelerator or incubator programs, which not only introduce these companies to Michigan but often lead to other opportunities within our ecosystem.

Collaborations by Outcome Type

Top Achievements

Worked with 2 Israeli companies to expand into Michigan and created 4 new jobs.

Introduced 3 Israeli companies to the Michigan ecosystem – 2 through Michigan-based accelerator programs and 1 as a recipient of an MEDC grant to pilot their technology in Michigan. Facilitated an additional 54 successful connections between Israeli and Michigan organizations. Completed 2 trade delegations to Israel prior to the pandemic, introducing 13 Michigan business leaders to Israeli innovation in the cybersecurity and Industry 4.0 sectors.

Leveraged the startupMICHIGAN.com platform to connect 2 Michigan MedHealth startups to a major health system, resulting in their acceptance into their co-development program. Completed 2 major online events for almost 300 attendees in our Innovation vs Corona series that exposed Israeli innovation and the role MIBA can play to advance Michigan's innovation ecosystem. Convened 2 sector-based working groups led by prominent industry leaders to bring together participants from around the state to identify gaps and opportunities and evaluate solution providers.





